MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Hill Valley Residents:

Some residents are concerned about the number of vehicles parked in the wrong direction on their street. The city has an ordinance stating that all vehicles need to be parked in the direction of the permitted flow of traffic. This allows reflectors on the back of vehicles to be seen at night. Also, it is unlawful for any vehicle to park in front of fire hydrants. The city ordinance states a vehicle must park at least 12 feet away from any fire hydrant any time day or night. To clarify, these are city rules and ordinances.

A resident called regarding golf carts on our streets. The city ordinance states that golf carts are allowed only on streets with a posted 25 MPH speed limit or less. Also, a driver's license is required to operate a golf cart in Indiana. This is good information to know and pass along.

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND TOX DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hazardous household waste consists of items like electronics (TV, Computers, Cell phones, etc.) cleaners, paint, motor oil, gasoline, fluorescent light bulbs, batteries, weed, and insect poisons that are dangerous to our environment. These items can be dropped off at any of the city's free Tox-Drop sites. Residents are limited to twenty-gallons (20) of liquid waste or seventy-five (75) pounds of solid waste, per visit. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the 2^{nd} Saturday of each month from 9am - 2pm.

BARKING DOG(S)

Do you have a dog that barks the first thing in the morning or the last thing at night? A barking dog is a problem for your neighbors who are attempting to sleep or even watch television and it is in violation of the city ordinance. (Indy Municode Sec. 531-204(a)) Howling, yelping, barking prohibited. Please go to the Mayor's Action Center to file a complaint. Continued violations may also subject the owner to impoundment of the animal.

WHAT IS ON THE TOP OF THE MONUMENT?

Liberty, Victory or simply "crowning figure" is standing atop the monument in the center of Monument Circle.

She is facing south with a sword in hand in case the South were to rise again (that is said with tongue in cheek because I really do not know).

Recognized as one of the world's outstanding monuments, the structure has come to symbolize both the City of Indianapolis and the state of Indiana. The Soldiers & Sailors Monument is Indiana's official memorial to the Hoosiers that served in the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, the Mexican War, the Civil War, the Frontier Wars and the Spanish-American War. Did you know that the monument is only fifteen feet shorter than the Statue of Liberty?
